Better understanding of global views on gender equality to ensure coherent and ambitious outcomes at the 2020 **Generation Equality Forum**





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WHY THIS SURVEY?

In 2020, in celebration of the first-ever global conference on women's rights in Beijing in 1995, France and Mexico will co-host the "Generation Equality Forum". This fifth edition of the conference will launch in Mexico (7-8 May) and conclude in Paris (7-10 July). The Generation Equality Forum will bring together government and civil society representatives from countries all over the world. It is a meeting which offers a unique opportunity to make concrete progress on women's rights and for the Sustainable Development Goals by 2030.

In order to stimulate and inform a public debate on gender equality and encourage ambitious political and financial commitments at the conference, Focus 2030 will carry out an international survey to analyse and compare public opinion, perceptions and attitudes across around fifteen countries. Through this survey, comparing public attitudes and perceptions on women's rights as well as priority actions to achieve gender equality, our aim is to **put the Generation Equality Forum at the heart of political and media agenda in 2020**. The extent to which heads of state and government are willing to commit at the conference will depend the level and volume of public and media support and interest for the Generation Equality Forum – and the issue of gender equality as a whole in 2020.

It is therefore essential that women's voices from all over the world are heard, and that a public debate and discussion of the key issues takes place around the Forum with civil society and governments. Our survey will support this discussion by gathering results across:

A range of 15 countries in all regions, including the co-host countries: France, Germany, the UK and the US in a first wave, with a second wave conducted in Mexico, China, India, South Africa, a West African country, etc.

15 identical questions asked in each country, to ensure a comparison of issues and priorities across regions and better identification of the best policies and programmes to tackle gender equality on a global scale.

An indicative set of primary target countries is shown here.










AN INTERNATIONAL SURVEY CONTRIBUTING TO Focus 2030's wider work on gender Equality in 2020

At the start of November 2019, Focus 2030 launched its "Beijing+25" programme. Focus 2030's mission is to create the conditions for an informed debate and for effective advocacy to achieve ambitious public policies on major development issues and the UN Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

Our thematic programmes are structured according to major national or international workstreams. Given that France is cohosting (with Mexico) the 5th UN conference on women's rights and gender equality, Focus 2030 will lend its expertise, network and efforts to ensuring that the Generation Equality Forum between May and July 2020 is a success. The main pillars of our programme are presented here on the right.





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WHAT TOPICS WILL BE Covered in the survey?

Our team of sociologists and development experts are already working alongside our partner organisations (NGOs, think tanks, institutions) to finalise a series of 15 closed questions for the survey. These questions will be asked in each country where the survey is conducted, adapted as necessary to fit the local context.

Some questions focus on gender equality as a daily experience; others cover women's rights as a national or international issue. This ensures that the data provides a way of comparing attitudes and perceptions across the countries covered, while also ensuring the results are relevant – and create debate – in each of the different countries where the survey was conducted.

In this way, some questions will seek to analyse views on whether gender equality has progressed for women over the last 25 years in their country. Similarly, respondents will be asked their thoughts on violence against women and girls, gender pay gaps, and gender stereotypes.

Other questions will aim to measure respondents' views on progress on women's rights internationally, across different angles. For example: "Do you think that women's rights worldwide have improved, got worse, or stayed the same?" or "Which of the following are the biggest obstacles to gender equality today in the world: political representation? Economic independence? Violence against women and girls? Sexual and reproductive health and rights? Legal or judicial rights? Access to education?"

Questions will be linked to the themes covered by the action coalition groups (as yet still being formed) which will provide the basis of discussions for the Generation Equality Forum.

Our questions will also be vetted by the expert members of the Focus 2030 Generation Equality work group, including UN Women France, CARE France, Equipop, ONE, Action Santé Mondiale, Oxfam, and more.







The methodology for the survey will depend on the polling institute and the target country.



For France, Germany, the UK and the US, the surveys will be carried out by polling institute YouGov via an **on-line questionnaire** answered by a representative sample of the population (2,000 people on average, with an error margin of +2/-2% depending on the country polled). For most of the countries, we will have online surveys.



Regarding polling in developing countries, such as in Francophone west Africa (Senegal, Côte d'Ivoire or Burkina Faso for example) the methodology will be mixed, including **face-to-face polling** which is more expensive than on-line administration.





Focus 2030 will use its own funds to provide for the baseline countries (France, Germany, the UK and the US) for the survey, as well as design and data analysis of the results for those and any other country covered. To make the survey as comparatively robust as possible, we are seeking financial support from partners to widen the survey to additional countries. We are currently already discussing partnerships with the City of Paris and the French Development Agency, as well as other public and private institutions.

The global budget to cover 16 countries will be around **290 000€**.




PREVIOUS REPORTS FROM FOCUS 2030






